To purchasers of corrugated boxes and sheets between October 1993 and November 1995 from Stone Container Corporation; Jefferson Smurfit Corp.; International Paper Co.; Georgia Pacific Corporation; Weyerhaeuser Paper Co.; Temple-Inland, Inc.; Gaylord Container Corp.; Union Camp Corp.; Tenneco Packaging; and Packaging Corporation of America.

Dear Sir or Madam,

On January 9, 2004 you were mailed a notice that advised you how to file a claim to recover alleged overcharges to the prices of corrugated boxes and sheets as part of the class action settlement reached in *In re Linerboard Antitrust Litigation*. The settlement provides for cash to be distributed based on purchases from the defendants during the relevant time period.

Funds remain in the settlement account that are available to persons who purchased corrugated boxes or sheets from certain manufacturers between October 1993 and November 1995. While your recovery depends on the size of your purchases, your distribution in the case may be significant and you can only recover if you file a claim form.

I write, as counsel for the classes, to encourage you to file a claim if you were a purchaser of corrugated boxes or sheets from the defendant companies during that period. The Court has extended the date for filing claims to May 15, 2004. This will be the final opportunity for you to file a claim. Copies of the claim form describing the relevant dates and the companies from whom purchases had to have been made to qualify to participate in the settlement are available on the Internet at www.linerboardclassnotice.com.

Every effort will be made to facilitate your filing of a claim. The Court and claims administrator are aware that the dates of purchases qualifying for filing a claim occurred a number of years ago and that records from that time period may no longer exist. Estimates may be accepted by the claims administrator and you should call them at (800)528-7199 if you would like assistance in filing a claim form or in determining how an estimate can be made. Certain companies have offered their services to members of the class for a fee to assist in filing claim forms. There is no need to use such services to file a claim and the claims administrator will answer any questions you have to facilitate your filing a claim.
